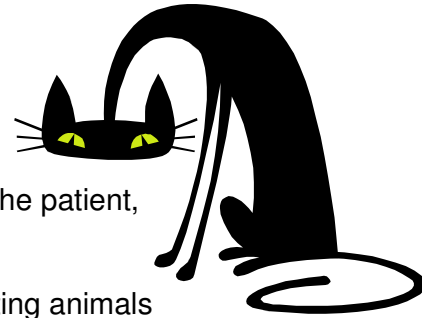


Taking the pet to the Vet

Homeopathy is essentially a natural healing process, providing remedies to assist the patient to regain health by stimulating the body's natural forces to heal the body. It concentrates on treating the patient, rather than the disease.



Homeopathy has become a popular method of treating animals that become unwell or upset while travelling to the vet or other places. Homeopathic remedies are not intended to replace qualified veterinary advice; therefore if your animal does not get better fairly quickly with homeopathic remedies please consult your regular Vet.

Homeopathic Remedies-dosage

You can purchase remedies from your local pharmacy, or health shop, in tablet, liquid or spray bottles. One tablet, one or two drops (unless specified on the bottle) or one to two sprays, equals one dose of a remedy. Give one dose at the onset of symptoms (unless otherwise indicated) and repeat every 10-30 minutes up to six doses. If there is no result at this time then your initial choice of remedy was incorrect and another choice is needed.

Choose the remedy that most closely fits the animal's state at the time

Going to the Vet

Aconite- for fear and fright, the animal will be anxious and restless. Dogs will often be wide-eyed and panting. This is also a good remedy for animals who take fright from thunderstorms, firecrackers, accidents and shock. Animals that exhibit fear of crowds, or strange places. They may be calmer outside in the fresh air. If Aconite does not work then consider Arsenicum

Gelsemium --for fear and fright, where the animal looks worn out or trembling and may not be able to hold itself upright. Urination and or diarrhoea from fear is not uncommon.

Use **Arnica** for trauma, bruising, surgery, fear and fright. Where an animal has been injured or has surgery, Arnica will speed up the healing process, reduce, swelling and pain along with restoring balance to blood clotting. A good indicator for this remedy is that the animal may not want to be touched or stroked on any part of the body. Do not give Arnica routinely before surgery unless the animal is injured. Post surgery give Arnica for 3 – 5 days and stop on relief.

Rescue remedy- is not a homeopathic remedy but a valid alternative to use for stress, trauma, and upsets for animal and owner alike. Four drops as necessary in the mouth or in drinking water or sprayed into the animal's mouth. It's valuable for stressed out or nervous owners too!

If the animal's condition does not improve, consult your vet
